For the years ended December 31, 2017 and 2016, the Cooperative had sales to Dakota Agronomy Partners, LLC totaling \$211,440 and \$399,624 respectively, of which \$7,212 and \$20,896 was receivable, respectively. For the years ended December 31, 2017 and 2016, the Cooperative had purchases from Dakota Agronomy Partners, LLC of \$9,493,042 and \$9,230,288, respectively of which \$196,553 and \$3,481 was payable, respectively. Dakota Agronomy Partners, LLC is 61.75% owned by CHS SunPrairie and 18.25% owned by Border Ag & Energy.





# 89TH ANNUAL MEETING MINUTES MARCH 30, 2017

Chairman Greg Marshall called the 89th annual meeting to order at 11:00 am at the Lewis & Clark Interpretive Center in Wasburn, ND. Chairman Marshall introduced members of the staff, CEO, CFO and the board of directors. In attendance were Dennis Carlson (CHS director), Denise Brown (NDFU) and Mike Frame (CHS Aligned Solutions). Board member Mark Larson introduced the 2017 scholarship winners present which were Kaitlyn Peterson, Tate Price and Donald Goven. Chairman Marshall called attention to the packets containing the financial report, minutes, meeting rules, forms and ballots. Chairman Marshall appointed Curt Abfalter as recording secretary. CFO Ricky Aberle presented the financial report for Enerbase. Gift certificates in the amounts of \$50 and \$100 were given out for door prizes. CEO Tony Bernhardt reported on past and current assets purchased for the last two years. He also stated that Enerbase continues to revolve estates and noted that the preferred share program still exists as a tool for stock retirement as well.

Chairman Marshall presented the audience with a financial history of Dakota Agronomy Partners and shared his prospective on Enerbase. DAP Manager Dan Sem reported on the ownership of DAP which is CHS SunPrairie, Border Ag and Enerbase. Chairman Marshall asked of interest for the nominating committee for next year and appointed Mark Giedd to represent south of the lake area. Denise Brown representing NDFU gave a report followed by Dennis Carlson, director on the CHS board. More door prizes were given out along with the 500 gallon prize of fuel or propane won by James McCullough. The meeting was then tabled until the evening at the Grand Hotel in Minot, ND.

Chairman Greg Marshall called the 89th annual meeting to order. Chairman Marshall called attention to the packets containing the financial report, minutes, meeting rules, forms and ballots. Secretary Craig Johnson read the notice of the annual meeting. Chairman Marshall appointed Lavon Wolf as recording secretary and Jason McKenney, NDFU, as parliamentarian. Chairman Marshall appointed an Election Committee: Kevin Bonness, Tom Burtch, Mark Giedd, Jeff Larson, Sheri Endresen, Al Medler, Amanda Haugen and Curt Abfalter. Secretary Johnson declared a quorum of 144 which included mail in ballots as well as the ballots that were cast at the meeting. Chairman Marshall introduced the Board of Directors, Manager, CFO, and their spouses. He also introduced CHS Director Jon Erickson, CHS National Accounts Director Mike Frame, and the speaker for the evening Shirley Cunningham, Executive VP Ag Business & Enterprise Strategy. Chairman Marshall asked for corrections or additions to the 2016 minutes as presented and printed. There were none. Motion to accept minutes was made by Tom Burtch and seconded by Jon Erickson, Motion carried.

Director Mark Larson presented the scholarship report. There were 23 applications with nine scholarships awarded this year. The scholarship winners were: Kaitlyn Peterson, Tate Price, Jessica Peterson, Kimberly Kolden, Rayson Renfrow, Garrett Aberle, Anna Zelinski, Alyssa Johansen, and Donald Goven.

Enerbase CFO Ricky Aberle presented the annual report. Enerbase had sales of \$110,623,432 in 2016 and a net savings of \$6,452,335 which was a 5.8% return on sales compared to \$153,256,282

sales in 2015 and \$7,492,518 in net savings for a 5% return in 2015. Petroleum made up 65% of Enerbase sales followed by 19% from Agronomy, 12% from General Merchandise, and 4% from Machinery and Services. Ricky also reported that Enerbase Assets and Accounts Receivable are in very good shape. Chairman Marshall asked for a motion to approve the annual report. Motion was made by Julia Johnson and seconded by Bruce Peterson. Motion carried.

Manager Tony Bernhardt presented the manager's report. Tony talked about Enerbase's mission which is "to serve the everchanging needs of our patron owners." Some of the improvements that were done last year were a new kerosene tank, new truck hoist, new underground pipes at Xpressmart location, painting the Ryder bulk plant and the remodel at the Washburn C-store which is still ongoing. The opportunity to exchange Enerbase equity from the years 2000 through 2005 for CHSCO stock will continue to be available and he also reminded patrons that estates and age 70's are paid out twice a year in June and December.

Chairman Marshall presented the board report. He announced that At Large Board Member Mark Larson and NW District Board Member Greg Marshall terms are expiring and both are eligible to run. He said Enerbase is in a strong financial position and that we are just going through a struggling cycle right now.

Manager Dan Sem presented the Dakota Agronomy report. On September 1, 2016 ownership of seed business was finalized by DAP. The new ownership will be CHS SunPrairie at 61.75%, Enerbase at 20% and Souris River Coop at 18.25%. DAP had \$86 million in ag sales and \$38 million in seed sales in 2016 with a profit of \$1.8 million. DAP is continuing to invest in efficiency and velocity for its patrons.

Craig Johnson was the only candidate running for NE District, Gary Knell was the only candidate for South of the Lake, and Darren Sletten was the only candidate for SW District. Unanimous ballots were cast for all three. They will serve three-year terms.

Shirley Cunningham, executive VP Ag Business & Enterprise Strategy was the keynote speaker. Her background includes working for Monsanto for 20 years and for CHS for 4 ½ years. She also spoke about the cycle that we are in right now but that we have all seen this before. The price trend in fertilizer is less soft going into 2018/2019 and the supply situation is good.

The nominating committee for the 2018 annual meeting was announced. They are Kevin Bonness, Tom Burtsch, Jeff Larson and Mark Giedd.

Door Prizes were given away through the night with the grand prize of 500 gallons of propane, gas, or fuel won by Blaine Kotasek. Chairman Marshall declared the meeting adjourned at 7:55pm.
